

Parent and Student Guide to STAR360 Assessments

Q: What are STAR Assessments?

A: STAR Assessments are short tests that provide teachers with learning data. STAR tests are computer-adaptive, which means they adjust based on each answer your child provides. This helps teachers get the best data to support your child in the shortest possible testing time.

Q: Which tests will my student take?

A: Grades 3–12 will take STAR Reading and STAR Math. Your teacher may give you additional or modified instructions on which tests to take and when to take them.

Q: What do teachers do with STAR Assessments?

A: Teachers use STAR Assessment data to learn what students already know and what they are ready to learn next, monitor student growth, and determine which students may need additional help. STAR Assessments are heavily researched and scientifically proven to help teachers guide each student on their unique path to mastery. For accuracy, it is extremely important that your students take these assessments with no assistance.

Q: What do STAR Assessments do for my child?

A: By pinpointing exactly what your child knows, teachers can personalize your child's practice to keep them growing. Plus, short test times ensure your child spends more time learning and less time testing.

Q: How many questions are on the tests?

A: STAR Reading and STAR Math will have around 30–35 questions.

Q: Is the test timed?

A: Each question is timed. The tests attempt to find out what the student knows and what the student can figure out. When students see a small clock appear at the top of the screen, they have 30 seconds left before the next question. Students can select an answer before it changes questions or let it change to the next question. Test questions get easier or harder depending on whether they get it right, wrong, or leave it blank.

Q: How can I help my child with their STAR Assessments?

A: The best way to support your child with STAR Assessments is to help them understand why they're taking them. STAR helps teachers see what your child already knows and where they may need extra support—so they can tailor instruction just for them.

If your child feels nervous, reassure them that there's no way to fail a STAR Assessment. It's not about grades—it's about doing their best and showing what they know. A calm, encouraging reminder can go a long way to help them feel confident.

Q: How do we get the results of the test?

A: You will receive an email with instructions on how to sign up for Home Connect to be notified of your child's test results. You must sign up before your child tests to receive the results, so be sure to check with their teacher before they begin testing.

Q: What do we need to take the test?

1. Be sure your Mozilla Firefox or Google Chrome browser is up to date.
2. Your teachers will provide you with the STAR360 web address. Each school has its own specific address.
3. Your student has a username and password, which will be emailed to you. You can also check with their teacher if you lost or forgot the information.

Q: Where do I go if I have questions?
